From the Desk of Gary Hocevar, Chief Education Officer/Principal

Dear Parents and Friends of TCMS:

The Back To Basics Charter School Foundation, Inc., which is the governing board for TCMS, was recently granted a fifteen year charter contract renewal to continue to operate the school.

It is highly unusual that a public charter school of choice is granted a fifteen year charter and TCMS joins Learning Gate as the only district charter schools that have been awarded such.

The district school board voted unanimously to issue the charter renewal during its February 1, 2011 meeting. We are deeply humbled by their action and honored by the trust they place in our employees and board.

A parent asked me yesterday what criteria are used in this renewal process. As I shared with the parent, the process began last year when I notified Mrs. Elia, Superintendent of Schools of my intention to submit to her board on behalf of my board a request for renewal and specifically for the fifteen year contract allowable under Florida law. Subsequently I proceeded to review the current charter application and document to edit, amend and add the necessary verbiage to reflect what we currently are doing and what is strategically planned for the coming fifteen years. The areas I needed to revisit were:

- Mission, Vision, Goals and Guiding Principles
- Curriculum and Instruction – Compliance with Department of Defense Curriculum and Standards, and the Florida Sunshine State Standards
- Financial accountability and execution
- Operations accountability and execution
- Facilities

Once the reapplication was reviewed and completed I requested that our governing board review and approve the document, which was then sent to the district in early August, 2010.

In early November a site visit team composed of SDHC administrators spent time on campus auditing the above mentioned areas. The team audited:

1. All certified teachers' lesson plans, grading, including progress monitoring, attendance and discipline
2. Data used to guide Academic Improvement/Academic (Enrichment) Plans
3. Evidence of differentiated instruction in alignment with Department of Defense and Sunshine State Standards per current charter and based on state regulations
4. Classroom procedures, teacher syllabus and teacher parent communications

- Various team members did classroom observations, including walk through and interviews with randomly selected faculty members and support staff
- Phone calls were made to parents asking relevant survey questions
- Four governing board members were interviewed separately

Prior to the site team's departure, the lead district administrator for the team conducted an exit meeting with me.

During the remaining weeks prior to the February approval, I negotiated our new contract with the Supervisor for Charter Schools. This certainly was an experience

Attention 6th Grade Parents

It's never too early to start thinking about IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS FOR SEVENTH GRADE FOR ENTRY INTO FLORIDA SCHOOLS:

The Florida Department of Health is requiring that students entering 7th grade receive the Tdap vaccine (combined Tetanus, Diptheria and Pertussis Vaccines).

Documentation from the student's health care provider should specify that the student has received the Tdap vaccine on the Florida Certificate of Immunization, AKA "blue form". All incoming 7th graders MUST submit this card prior to the first day of 7th grade.

The blue card can be turned in or mailed to the clinic or the front office. I always encourage parents to turn the form in early, rather than on the first day of school. Also, by law, I must have the actual blue card, not a photo copy. (I will be happy to copy it for you) If you have any questions please feel free to contact me.

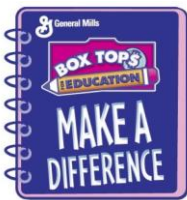


