In Mrs. Wiseman's U.S History class, students are learning about:

- the Reconstruction
- the Industrial Revolution and Remarkable Inventions

In Mr. Salazar's U.S. History class, students:

- have learned about the conflicts, ideology and disagreements that tore this nation apart leading it to the Civil War.
- have learned about the Civil War strategies, weaponry, technology, main battles and how the war affected not only the military but also the civilian population.
- in commemoration of African-American History Month, they learned of the heroics of the 54th Massachusetts Regiment, the first Black regiment to see action in the Civil War, and the impact their heroics had on the morale of African Americans. Students then watched the movie "Glory" which honors said regiment. They then designed posters depicting the heroism and courage of the 54th Massachusetts Regiment.
- are now studying the effects of reconstruction in the South after the Civil War.

In Language Arts, students:

- will continue to hone their writing skills by working on FCAT Explorer and other in-class reading activities.
- will be practicing for FCAT Writes on March 1st.
- will begin the novel, [To Kill A Mocking Bird](#) by Harper Lee

In Algebra I Honors:

- students began their study of Chapter 8, which is the beginning of the "hard core" algebra that they will be seeing for the rest of the year, and into high school too!
- the concepts of factoring and FOIL-ing have sunk in, and they are going to need it for the remaining chapters.
- remember, math continually builds up on itself and a loose basic idea makes the entire chapter difficult to master, so please make sure your child is

Attention 6th Grade Parents

It's never too early to start thinking about IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS FOR SEVENTH GRADE FOR ENTRY INTO FLORIDA SCHOOLS:

The Florida Department of Health is requiring that students entering 7th grade receive the Tdap vaccine (combined Tetanus, Diphtheria and Pertussis Vaccines).

Documentation from the student's health care provider should specify that the student has received the Tdap vaccine on the Florida Certificate of Immunization, AKA "blue form". All incoming 7th graders MUST submit this card prior to the first day of 7th grade.

The blue card can be turned in or mailed to the clinic or the front office. I always encourage parents to turn the form in early, rather than on the first day of school. Also, by law, I must have the actual blue card, not a photo copy. (I will be happy to copy it for you) If you have any questions please feel free to contact me.

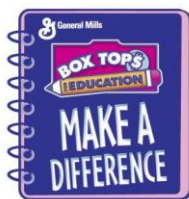
Favorite Teacher Essay Contest


