“Shadowing” Fact Sheet

1. Students and parents should have already attended or plan to attend an information meeting/ open house when considering shadowing. Shadowing is a privilege not a requirement. Also, check with your school guidance office to find out when we will be visiting your school.
2. Please make your appointment **AT LEAST** three days in advance – space is limited to only 3 students per day. Each student may shadow only one day.
3. Check with your current school for permission (school business). We provide each student with a letter confirming their visit.
4. Prior to calling for an appointment:
 - Check your child's schedule. Choose a few dates that do not conflict with tests, field trips, presentations, etc. It will save all of us time. We do not shadow on Mondays or early release days.
 - Check your IB program attendance area: http://www.sdhc.k12.fl.us/magnet/high_ib.asp
If you live in Robinson IB, King IB, Hillsborough, or Strawberry Crest IB attendance area you will shadow at *that* school.
5. Parents must make the appointment. No students will be allowed to make their own appointment.
6. Shadows will be escorted throughout the day by freshman class members only—

PROGRAMME DESCRIPTION

The International Baccalaureate (IB) Programme of Hillsborough County is a magnet program that provides **highly motivated college-bound** students the opportunity to participate in a **rigorous** liberal arts curriculum. The program is a four-year course of study with two phases: Grades 9 and 10 are the Pre-Diploma Programme, and Grades 11 and 12 is the IB Diploma Programme. Students apply in 8th grade to enter the program beginning in 9th grade.

Application Period for the 2011-2012 School Year

December 1, 2010 - January 12, 2011

During the Application Period, students currently enrolled in HCPS may apply online at www.sdhc.k12.fl.us/magnet. Students not currently enrolled in HCPS need to download the all-in-one paper application at <http://www.mysdhc.org/magnet>.

Currently there are three high schools offering the IB Programme: King, Hillsborough and Robinson. Strawberry Crest High School is currently going through the process of authorization from the International Baccalaureate Organization (IBO). Upon acceptance into the Hillsborough County IB Programme as a rising 9th grader, students will attend the high school based on their attendance area middle school according to their residential address.

PREREQUISITE/ELIGIBILITY FACTORS

Algebra I Honors (preferred) or Algebra I with a C or better, completed by the end of 8th grade.

GPA: academic subjects/grades from 7th grade and first half of 8th grade

Test scores: standardized test scores from 6th and/or 7th grade

Writing sample: The HCPS 8th grade Writing Assessment taken November 15-19, 2010, in the 8th grade Language Arts class, is the official writing sample for the magnet high school application.

Non-HCPS or non-charter 8th grade students must attend one of the following writing sessions:

The goal of the IB curriculum is to develop learners who become:

Inquirers They acquire the skills necessary to conduct constructive inquiry and research, and become independent active learners demonstrating that natural curiosity is nurtured. They actively enjoy learning and this love of learning will be sustained throughout their lives.

Knowledgeable They explore concepts, ideas and issues which have global relevance and importance. In so doing, they acquire, and are able to make use of a significant body of knowledge across a range of disciplines.
